WEST LEECHBURG BOROUGH GRASS CUTTING POLICY

The Borough will not cut grass/weeds/growth on the right-of-way of any developed lot. That property between the property line and the roadbed, will be the responsibility of the property owner to maintain according to the Borough Grass Ordinance.

The Borough may, at the discretion of the Street Committee and if it is deemed to be a safety hazard to vehicles or pedestrians, cut the grass/weeds/growth on the right-of-ways of the following:

1. State property
2. School property
3. Any railroad or industrial property
4. Any wooded lot or undeveloped lot
5. In the immediate area of any borough signs
6. Any corner or blind spot

UNDEVELOPED LOT - lot with no structures

DEVELOPED LOT - a lot with any type of structure

RIGHT-OF-WAY - a strip of land dedicated to and improved for public use, providing access to properties or lots that abut it and connecting to other public ways, or an easement across private property for the passage of public utilities or the disposal of storm water, or private vehicular passage. The most common right-of-way is the grass area from the property line to the pavement of the road.
